





### Senior Men's County team 2018/19

This season ES introduced a new format for the ICC.

Bringing all southern teams to a central venue and all northern teams to a central venue

This meant a trip to Brighton and Sussex for the men's team

Here we were split into 4 groups consisting of 4 counties. The winner of each group would make it through to the finals weekend in Nottingham.

We were pitted against Wiltshire, Norfolk and Berkshire

With only the winner going through to the finals the pressure was on In each fixture!

### Senior Men's County team 2018/19 (Cont.)

The Avon team was missing a little fire power and depth with the absence of Dave Allman and Peter Joyce. Our team of Sam Ellis, Rich King, John Welton, Jack Alcock and Sam Barham were still looking a solid group but no substitute would mean 3 tough matches in 2 days.

The Boys played brilliantly well in each fixture and we came away with 3 victories from 3 meaning a date in Nottingham with the 16 best counties in the country.

## Senior Men's County team 2018/19 (Cont.)

So we Jumped in Jack Alcocks wagon and made the next long trip to Nottingham.

The level was exceptional as we faced the best county sides from north and south playing off for a place in next years premier division.

With a lot the of the teams able to field some of the best players on the planet including, Tom Richards, Adrian Waller, Nick Wall to name a few.

The same team was fielded once more this time the format saw us pitted in a 8 team monrad. This meant a crucial first round match vs a very strong Hampshire side. They took the game 5-0 but it was very well contested.

## Senior Men's County team 2018/19 (Cont.)

Next up a huge tie vs Middlesex on the Saturday afternoon. We sadly lost 3-2 with two matches finishing 3-2!

This meant a wooden spoon match Sunday morning vs a Young Yorkshire 2 side. Again a great effort from the team but a 4-1 lose.

A win vs Middlesex would have seen a 5/6 playoff and that left a sour taste but overall incredibly proud of the team to make it to the finals weekend! With such a small pool of players compared to the other counties we really do punch above our weight!!

#### County Events Update - Masters Men

The O45s were hosted by Devon at Exeter Golf and Country Club we had a fairly strong side out and had to play Devon & Gloucestershire (after Wiltshire pulled out having struggled to get a team.

Devon have some of the best players in the country, but fortunately a couple of them were unavailable, which made it a really even contest.

At one, Adrian Duncan played Mike Gregory who still plays for the Full Devon County side and is a quality stroke player. He went down 3-0 despite a great effort.

### County Events Update - Men (Cont.)

At Four, Jason Mathias played at 4 who lost 3-0 in a disappointing performance.

At Two, Mike Nicholls went on and lost the first, before coming back to win the second before his opponent pulled up injured.

At Five, Rich Dodsworth put in a fantastic performance full of determination...and the odd frame shot and came home 3-1.

This took the match into a decider. Ian Fudge playing at 3 had a royal battle but couldn't quite get going and went down 3-0.

### County Events Update - Men (Cont.)

We then romped home against a weak Gloucestershire side who only had 4 players, with some good performances all round...especially Adrian Duncan at one who didn't let his opponent get into it with a powerful performance. A 4-1 team win.

That meant we finished second for the weekend and managed to qualify for the National Finals in The Midlands later this month – The top 8 counties from the country who play a Monrad format knock out.

#### County Events Update - Men (Cont.)

The O55 team begun its defence of their national title in Exeter in March, comfortably winning both matches against Devon and Somerset.

The finals are in Coventry on June 22nd, where Andy Killey, Mike Martin, Jeremy Goulding, Nick Drysdale, Julian Moore and Mark Byron will once again be donning their county shirts for the glory of Avon!!

#### **County Events Update - Ladies**



## League Participation - Number of Clubs




Losing 9 clubs in the last 5 years - not counting those clubs sharing courts

## England Squash (ES) NGB



- ES are our national governing body (NGB)
- Support squash from new participants, to grass roots up to the elite players with various programmes
- Represent more than 200,000 people in England who play squash each week in more than 4,200 facilities
- Promote and support events at international, national, area and county level for all ages from the Dunlop British Junior Open to the Allam British Open.
- Identify and develop the country's most talented squash players
- Support a vast network of qualified coaches
- Enable funding for local and regional activities that promote participation

# England Squash (ES) NGB (Cont.)



- ES are funded by Sport England who, in turn, are funded from the National Lottery
- They also receive funds from membership
- As National Lottery funds drop significantly (as for all sports), membership income is becoming increasingly important. Many counties are now mandating ES membership in order to play in their leagues.
- Sport England are measuring ES on the success of our top English players (and we are between 'golden generations' at the moment...) and of the ES participation programs; Squash 101, Squash Girls Can, Junior Squash 101.
- We don't have to be too specific about running 'Squash 101' all we need to do is record the attendance of any group coaching sessions on the ES Squash 101 app and they will count. The target is achievable and we need to do our bit (or ES will lose even more funding).

# ES membership - Avon's Perspective




- As Sport England funding declines, so the importance of ES membership to the future of our sport goes up. We want to support them.
- Avon mandate ES membership for league players mixed and ladies, winter and summer leagues
- By doing this we (Avon) get the 'quadruple rebate' £4 back per player and 20% of our club affiliation fees. Normally £1 and 12.5%.
- Players also get
  - Public liability and personal accident insurance (worth £30)
  - Free SquashLevels membership (worth £5)
  - Discounts from online squash kit stores (typically 10%)
  - Squash Player magazine (worth £5)
  - Early access to national tickets, access to training content on the ES website, etc.
- It's certainly worth £12!
- We would encourage club players to join too for both their own and the county's benefits

# **CAN - County Association Network**



- The CAN is a group of county reps who represent grass roots squash to ES
- We act as consultants for ES if they want to get feedback or input from grass roots
- We have helped with IT feedback, inter-county feedback, membership feedback
- It's also a forum for sharing best practice across all the counties in the country
- Richard Bickers is the Avon rep and IT consultant
- Conall Platts is the (new) Safeguarding consultant
- We are different to the national and regional forums as they are for rolling out ES initiatives whereas the CAN is much more of an input to ES.
- We have been 'constructively vocal' and often don't agree with ES policy

Overall, the county made a profit of £3,133 this year, due to:


- An increase in **League Fees** collected this year after the rise in entry fees approved at last years AGM. This is really important in getting regular income streams to fund continued county development
- Our **England Squash Funding** increased as a consequence of the increase in rates for us all having ES membership, and an additional £1,500 grant for the work we're doing in the background on **County Development**
- **County Matches** decreased as a result of the new format. We no longer need to pay to host matches.
- **Website management** costs include the development of the new Avon County website.


#### Analysis of income

## League fees analysis

#### Key points:

- We had a lively discussion on league fees at last year's AGM
- The county is now operating at a profit, but this before the proposed plans discussed later on.
- The end goal is to have sufficient income to fund continued spend on county development

**Proposal**: Raise the league fees by £5 per team for each league. This will fund next season's plans, and I will return to you all next year with a full budget on how the county development will unfold financially

- A long, slow process to create this plan
- 10 day consultation period now open for County to comment
- Final version released end of June along with detailed project plan for Year 1
- Focus is on increasing participation women, juniors and racketball
- Requires people and funding

#### **Current state**

- The county is undergoing a long, slow death
- We need to ensure the county has a future
- That means broader, younger, more diverse participation
- This sort of change needs focus more than voluntary work can provide

- Appoint Development Officer
  - Not a Year 1 goal
  - A lot of work to be done yet to implement this
  - Requires reliable recurring income of £10K per year (PT) to fund this alone
  - Current levels of recurring income approx £2K per year available for development
  - Current income supplemented by ES grants but cannot rely on this always being available
  - Can be supplemented from cash reserves for a short period of time
  - Need clear goals and very tight control to ensure value for money

#### Highlights/Goals of Plan

Reasons this should be a paid role

- Volunteers struggle to have time required; existing ones are overstretched and few in number
- Will liaise and working with relevant organisations or agencies including youth services, schools, clubs, sports coaches, sports councils, local government
- Requires a lot of time to build relationships
- Will organise and, develop a varied range of activities, projects or programmes
- Fill source funding, manage budgets, maintain statistical and financial records
- Will monitor and assess progress
- The work can be demanding, with long hours and some evening, weekend and public holiday work

- Have squash join the Bristol School Games
- New events for all increasing participation beyond existing leagues
  - Appoint an Events Coordinator
  - Women only weekly sessions in clubs and county level event
  - County handicap tournament
  - Racketball league
  - County closed/open racketball tournament
  - Support for clubs/leisure centres to create sessions for beginners funding will be available
  - Create long term calendar of County tournaments on rotating basis with clubs

- At AGM 2020 present budget for 2021
- Update governance of County
  - We benefit from public sector grants and have to comply with the Code for Sports Governance.
- Create and fill following new roles
  - Head of Womens' Development
  - Head of Coaching
  - County Team Manager
- Elect a new Chair

- We need more volunteers both at committee and club level
- We need radical ideas for increasing our recurring income
- Funding application being submitted to ES
  - £3k for general development
  - 1K for talent development
- We need help marketing what we do (squash and racketball)
- Rollout new funding opportunity for clubs/communities





# Topics raised/Rule updates



- PAR scoring in use for a year now. Generally gone well. Here to stay!
- Quite a bit of feedback received over 'unfair teams' since we dropped the order change rule
  - Clubs making use of available players from the teams above
  - Not so serious if from the division above but not fair if from 4 divisions above!
  - Much more prevalent with so many non-Weds matches and matches spread over more weeks (this Spring league was unusual as Easter was so late) - means that top team players are more available
  - We need to do something don't want to bring the order change rule back but need to constrain the ability to play higher team players
  - Quite a few suggestions received. Many around using level to ensure fairness.
  - No obvious solution so we'll set up a working group to address over summer

# IT update



- Avon Squash website up and running. Still in need of content. For non-league information.
- Continuing to develop badsquash league site. Somerset and Gloucestershire also use it.
- Boxes available
  - Automates nearly everything
  - Gives non-league players a level
  - Wall mode works nicely with a tablet on the wall (e.g. Redland, Weston)
  - Free to use
- Plugs into SquashLevels the national ranking system. We all have a national ranking. Follow the link from your player details page.
- Working with other system developers for us to have a tournament system that we can use for ad hoc tournaments across Avon. Make tournaments easy to run.

# ES membership tracking



- All league players who have played 3 matches need to be ES members
- This supports ES and ensures Avon gets the extended rebate.
- The badsquash tracks and checks ES membership
  - ES numbers need to be entered into badsquash
  - Badsquash makes call to ES membership system to check
  - If member via your club then your club's affiliation needs to be current
  - You can check by looking at your player history page it is rechecked at that time
