Matters arising and approval of 2016 AGM minutes

Treasurer's report

The bank balance has swelled from £10,786.92 (30/04/2016) to £13,926.18 (as at 30/04/2017). This was mainly due to expenditure being lower than in previous years largely down to spending less on inter-counties. Takings were also up which was due to a rebate from the South West regional forum.

The treasurer requests again that clubs/teams pay their league fees promptly before the start of each season, thank you. I am stepping down after 6 years of doing this role and thank you for all the support from everyone. Duncan Higgins will take over the role of treasurer and I wish him all the very best in the role.

Junior development update

Richard King (Avon Squash Junior Development Manager) wasn't able to attend in person as his best friend was getting married in Romania (!) but his report was read out at the AGM and is included here.

It's exciting to announce that since I took this role 2 years ago that this season is the first year for a few years were I genuinely believe we have a really good numbers and a core of juniors playing/competing across Avon at various clubs and venues. This is now starting to see this spread up through into the local junior tournaments and now into the county teams.

One of the main reasons for the increase is there are now consistent coaching structures and programs based at Lansdown, Redland Green, Vivo along with Junior activity still happening at Thornbury.

With a large proportion of our juniors aged 8-15 it is really important that we maximize their potential with support/tournaments/coaching/Inter-county activity as well as maximizing our older juniors who will soon be leaving the junior categories by offering them support to take coaching badges to enable them to inspire our next generation of juniors.

The consistency of coaching offered across the various clubs is vital for the development of juniors as well as the ability to play and compete amongst juniors across all the clubs.

We have created many different events and avenues to support all levels of juniors and participation across the county with the aim to get people into the county structure.

This season Avon entered 5 teams; the same as the previous season into the Inter-County Championships with a Boys Under 13,15,17,19 team entered and also a Girls Under 17's team.

All teams and players competed very well throughout the tournament with a special congrats to the Girls team for reaching the trophy Final.

We are very confident of being able to maintain these teams next season if not add an additional team as the young players are now developing and ready for County activity.

The Avon Junior Squash Grand Prix 16/17 season (Graded event for all abilities)

This Circuit has been running for 3 seasons now with the idea of encouraging Avon Squash's juniors to participate in competition but in a less intimidating environment than say an England Squash event.

We have been averaging 40 juniors at these events with a successful graded event held by Redland and a very successful county closed event also held at Redland this year which saw almost 50 entrants and various winners based at many different clubs. With 2 events to go one at Vivo on the 25th June and another to be arranged at Lansdown we hope these to be just as successful!

It is really important that as a county we keep providing opportunities for all abilities and these graded events are a perfect way to inspire our juniors into more competitive situations in the future.

With the Great help of John Welton, Rose Bamber and Charlotte Weldrake (county coaches) we have been running boys/girls development squads which have been running for 2 years now and our aim to encourage boys/girls to develop in an environment surrounded by juniors from many clubs and supported by Avon's best coaches. The popularity of these sessions has grown and really had a positive effect across the county.

It is really vital that the county takes a stance to financially support and continue to encourage the coaches and opportunities for our juniors for their future development.



We currently around 700 players – fairly constant but, if anything, increasing. Interesting recent peak of over 800. The ladies are reporting a fall in numbers so it's not all good. I'll update the chart to show the different leagues and types of match so we can see what's going on in more detail.

Unfortunately, we continue to lose courts and this is having a knock-on effect to generating the fixtures which is getting harder and harder.

Data is available for individual clubs too. Same page on the website – just scroll down to find your club.

England Squash update

We no longer have a regional rep so this is from our direct participation at ES council meetings and communications. We also asked Keir Worth (England Squash CEO) for his input specific to Avon.

Context

Sport England are changing their focus from raw participation to getting new players on board and that's measured through ES membership.

Sport England are the England Squash paymasters and have cut funding significantly which means losing people. They had 75 two years ago, 35 one year ago and are now down to 16!

It means they can't do much but are willing to help those counties who ask for it.

There is a parallel organisation formed – the CAN (County Association Network) – and Avon is represented. We are trying to work out how best to work with ES going forward. In general, the main push from the CAN is for England Squash to include the counties much more in their decision making.

We may be able to access more funding for our county with some effort. We need to decide what we want.

Comments from Keir Worth

Over the last 2 years, ES has invested £300K into the counties via the national and regional forums. £1M over the last 4 years. Avon clubs have received £45K of this. There is more available going forward.

ES opposed the closure at Bath Sports.

A focus on membership benefits is being prepared for the board's approval in the next two weeks. It will include insurance, access to content ('how to' squash clips / instruction and coaching), discounts from squash manufacturers and on specific events (such as the British Open) and improved access to better technology.

ES continues to support Squash Girls Can and Squash 101 which is being taken up by an increasing number of clubs.

Avon county view

Every proper sport has an NGB. We want a strong NGB to support our sport nationally and we should support them.

We'd like something back for our investment. League players probably don't need much but we'd like to see investment in juniors and facilities. There is a fund available we can tap. We should take advantage of it.

In theory, everyone who plays squash should be a member of ES but our compromise is to only expect regular, Autumn/Winter league players to join.

We recognise that the ES membership system is clunky and are giving everyone time to join. We've had 12 months now! The start of next Autumn league is the final date for clubs to get organised.

The checks are now in place on badsquash and will be switched on at the start of next Autumn league. That will mean penalties.

The rule is - for every member of a team that has played three times or more there must be a member of that team who is an ES member.

There are two places to look on the badsquash website:

- The team page shows membership details and player attendance counts.
- There is an Admin pull-down for overall lists of players and membership numbers.

The team captains do need to enter the membership numbers into the website.

Election of officers

Of the four positions currently filled, three are stepping down this year.

- Chairman Nick Drysdale. Our county rep to ES. Stepping down this year.
 - Seamus Singh volunteered
 - Proposed by Brian Pate, seconded by Richard Dodsworth.
 - Approx 40 votes from the floor in favour carried
 - Seamus Singh will be the new chairman for Avon county.
- Treasurer Olly Morrall. Moving away so stepping down this year.
 - Duncan Higgins volunteered
 - Proposed by Seamus Singh, seconded by Pete Blue
 - Approx 40 votes from the floor in favour carried
 - Duncan Higgins will be the new treasurer

- League secretary (mixed) Richard Bickers. No change.
- League secretary (ladies) Pippa Green. Stepping down
 - Ruth Drysdale and Karan de Klerk volunteered (to share the role)
 - Proposed by Rose Bamber, seconded by Daryl Williams
 - Approx 40 votes from the floor in favour carried
 - Ruth Drysdale and Karan de Klerk share the ladies league secretary role
- Inter-county communication new role
 - It was felt that it would be very useful if there was more communication around the inter-counties, masters and junior age groups. This would cover finding players and also updating progress and results.
 - John Welton volunteered. Pippa volunteered to help identify potential inter-county players from the league.


Do remember that these roles are voluntary and on top of everything else we are trying to do. It's always nice to be offered help.

League reports Mixed - Richard Bickers

• Continuing to run Autumn, Winter, Play-offs, Summer and doubles

- About 800 fixtures. Some rearrangements but nearly all were played.
- Difficult to work around court availability and team constraints. Please be flexible if asked.
- Knowing which teams are playing is main input from captains. Any team changes cause major re-fixturing!
- Single column, two up/two down working well.
- Vivo Pirates 1 won both halves in Prem A they are the league champions!
- Weston 1 won both Div 2 first half and Div 1 second half!
- All three Kingsdown teams featured in the play-offs

Ladies - Pippa Green

We started the season in September, with only 2 divisions this time, having reduced from 3 the previous season, due to 3 teams leaving the League. The remaining 12 teams had a good run before Xmas, with no notable problems really, (except my personal poor run of injuries!) - and by Christmas, Redland Jaguars were at the top of Division 1, whilst Redland Lynx topped Division 2.

We did not hold the pre-Christmas tournament we had enjoyed the previous 2 years.

2 teams were demoted and 2 promoted from Div 2/1 respectively and we restarted in January. By the end of the second half, Lansdown had won the 1st division and Vivo the 2nd.

We held play-offs at Lansdown yesterday- Tuesday 9th May,

- The winners of Div 1 : Redland Jaguars
- The winners of Div 2 : Vivo

My first significant observation is that numbers were definitely down within the ladies game this year;- a number of long-standing league players seeming to drift away from the game this season. We are all getting older I suppose! The stalwarts will not be here indefinitely. But there are relatively few new players, and no new teams. Last years' increased support from the Universities was not repeated this year, and the Avon County girls were not represented this year either.

I also noted that there were more fixtures this year where teams did not field the full quota of 5 players. (20 fixtures in total where incomplete teams were represented)

This does represent a worrying decline in ladies activity. I am unable exactly to explain this nor understand it myself, but numbers are down! We have had 2 new younger players at Lansdown this season, benefitting from the closure of squash courts at Bath Leisure Centre last Summer- and Weston may have had a new player or two in recent 2 years? Redland still seem to have good female representation too.

Is there anything we can do to encourage more ladies locally to take up the challenge of playing the game and then competing as well? Ladies team coaching at Lansdown seems to have helped bond ladies team members, encourage increased participation has been very much appreciated - could this be rolled out into other clubs with similar benefits perhaps?

I am hoping to offer the role of Ladies League secretary to someone new this coming season and have asked for volunteers- But I have thoroughly enjoyed the role over the recent 3 years, and found the Committee and the ladies team captains to be extremely supportive - many thanks to you all!

Doubles

No report for doubles this year.

Topics raised/Rule updates

The following topics were sent to the committee before the AGM and the proposers were invited to present their case before the 40+ attendees. We had good debate and mixed opinion on all topics!

- Should teams get a bonus for having (and using) a qualified ref?
 - The idea is to encourage more players to become qualified referees and therefore improve the standard of refereeing across the county.
 - Wales already have a system like this that works well.
 - The proposal was to start this next season along with offering some refereeing courses.
 - The idea as-is was put to the attendees but it was voted against 18 to 3.
 - In general the idea was well received but it was agreed to adopt a more staged approach with a plan to be developed by a separate working group. This was voted in favour by 22 attendees.
 - Action: Set up working group.
- Should we run a county knock-out event?
 - This would be a team event once a year
 - Mark Regan would run it (or find someone to run it)
 - Voted in favour by 12 attendees. None against.
 - Action: Mark Regan.
- Should we do something with our cash reserves to do more development with juniors?
 - We have a great junior program now but could do much more by going in to schools
 - Similar to the very successful programs in Wiltshire and also Kent.
 - We could also run taster sessions.
 - Karina would like to do something proactive along these lines at Redmaid School
 - Chew Valley are hoping to do run some initiatives to increase participation. Can they get some exhibition quality players down for a day?
 - This is an area we should be able to get additional funding from ES.
 - Voted in favour unanimously.
 - Action: With the committee to progress next steps. Include those parties (e.g. Chew) who expressed active interest.
- Should we run a racketball league?
 - Original suggestion was to replace the doubles league with a racketball league but that wasn't popular.
 - May be run in addition. Would have to look at court availability and pick a different day of the week.
 - Note that some counties run mixed singles and doubles team matches. Badsquash will be modified to support that.
 - Voted in favour by 19 attendees.
 - Action: With Duncan Higgins to work with the league secretaries and committee to see what can be done.
- Rule changes should we do away with the order change rule?
 - This comes up every year. In general we don't like the rule and feel something based on levels could be better but we can never agree what that something should be.
 - Agreed to set up a separate working party to take a look at this one.

- Action: Set up working party.
- Can we make food optional?
 - One or two teams feel it is difficult and arrange food due to the late hours after matches.
 - Good discussion made it apparent that this was an all teams or no teams decision. It's not workable to have a few teams not provide food.
 - General feeling that the food and drink afterwards is what makes players stick around and be social which is half of what the league is all about. Summer league can be a bit flat as so many players leave straight away to get back and eat.
 - Vote held and agreed to keep the food requirement 25 to 0.

Notices

There will be a George Morgan memorial return match on 24th June between Bradley Stoke and Vivo, this time at Vivo. It will be a mix of squash and party and everyone is invited. It is hoped to eventually turn it into a recognised charity PSA event with all proceeds going to the British Heart Foundation.

IT update

Badsquash continues to develop. Features such as the head-to-head are new this year. Note that registration is free as it's covered by the county so it's a good idea to register so the system knows who you are. This will give you personalised pages like 'My history' and give you personalised rankings, highlight which divisions you've played in etc.

In case you didn't know, Somerset and Gloucestershire counties also use badsquash. There are around 45 England Squash counties and they all use one of about 10 league systems. There are a lot out there! The big ones are resultszone and leaguemaster in terms of number of counties served – they don't do as much as badsquash though!

Boxes

There are still quite a few clubs who still use spreadsheets and paper to run their boxes. This is just a reminder that you can run your boxes semi-automatically on badsquash for free.

- Automates nearly everything
- Gives non-league players a level
- Wall mode works nicely with a tablet on the wall (e.g. Redland, Weston)
- Free to all clubs
